July 7, 2020 Town Council Meeting Highlights

Administrative Highlights

- Town Hall and Animal Services are now open to the public, offering in person service by appointment only
- www.caledon.ca gets a fresh new mobile-friendly look and feel! With a renewed focus on providing services through a simplified, easy to use navigation structure, while maintaining accessibility for all site visitors – check it out!

Financial Highlights

- The 2020 Quarter 1 Operating Budget Variance is showing an overall favourable variance of \$731,229.00, as of March 31, 2020. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, it is anticipated that revenues will be significantly impacted in Quarter 2 reporting and year-end projections

Community Highlights

- In support of recommendations from Peel Public Health regarding the use of non-medical masks, the Town introduced a new By-law to require mandatory face coverings in indoor spaces and vehicles accessible to the public in the Town of Caledon
- To assist Town of Caledon affiliate groups, all permit fees for outdoor sports fields have been waived until September 6, 2020
- Registration for modified summer camp is now available, with the first week of 'Camp Caledon' starting July 20. The program will run for 7 weeks, until September 4 at the Caledon Centre for Recreation and Wellness, Albion Bolton Community Centre and Mayfield Recreation Complex.
- The GTA West Project Team continues to work with staff outlining preferred routes for the Highway 410 extension
- As part of the Peel 2041 Regional Official Plan and Municipal Comprehensive Review, the Region is analyzing targeted growth areas within the Town of Caledon
- The Town has requested the Peel Urban Forestry Group to investigate and report back on insect infestations and increasing issues concerning Gypsy Moths
- With the Bolton Downtown Revitalization Plan, Council will be undertaking a comprehensive business and public participation model with staff on the development of the Plan, incorporating four key priorities consisting of recommended actions to accomplish the overall strategic objective
